Alabama Public Service Commission Announces State's Finalist for "Anybody Can Serve / 30-60-90 Day Challenge"

Montgomery – The Alabama Public Service Commission today announced the state's finalist for the Anybody Can Serve/30-60-90 Day Challenge. Thomas Amp and Judy Bickerstaff of Oneonta, Alabama, were selected to represent the state of Alabama in the national campaign to promote energy efficiency.

Over the past several weeks the Commission encouraged Alabama consumers with incomes of less than \$50,000 to complete the online registration for an opportunity to have their energy bills paid for 3-months. Entries were fielded on the Commission's website and channeled to NetCommunications, a contractor designated by the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners, which is the sponsor of the Anybody Can Serve campaign.

Families from across the country will participate in the energy efficiency competition, which is designed to highlight the importance of conserving energy. To aid them in their conservation measures, families will receive a toolkit equipped with caulking, compact fluorescent bulbs, weather stripping and the like, and also will be given a webcam to chronicle their participation in the campaign. After putting the toolkit to work, the families will compare their utility bills for April, May and June with bills for the same months last year. The family that has saved the most since last year will win. The prize is three months of free utility service.
